We can eat dumplings because they look like gold ingots.






What is your favourite dish to eat at Lunar New Year?





My favourite thing about Lunar New Year is going to the flower markets! We can see so many beautiful flowers and plants. They all have different meanings.














Mandarins, also called 'Kut' are very popular during Lunar New Year.
